For example, today (5/25) I was at the light at westbound Red Cliffs Dr to make a left onto Mall Dr at 4:30pm. During 2 cycles of the lights, the left turn arrow from Red Cliffs to Mall never turned green, went to immediate flashing yellow. With the heavy traffic this time of day, I witnessed several vehicles chance their luck to make the left turn. Motorists frustration with not getting the green arrow causes them to take unnecessary chances which ultimately is going to lead to accidents. I can see flashing yellow in the overnight hours but with the growth of St George and the obvious inc rease in traffic, it's time to revisit this practice.
