Facility

The Canyons Complex 1890 W. 2000 N. St. George, UT 84770

The Canyons Softball Complex has received the coveted recognition of "Complex of the Year" nine times; the National Softball Association eight times and Senior Softball Association one time.

Facility Rules

- Pets are prohibited within the Canyons Complex except for service animals during this event.
- NO outside food or coolers of any kind
- Per city ordinance, no alcohol or smoking permitted within the complex or parking lot.

Locker Rooms

There are no locker room facilities at the Canyons Complex.

Parking

Parking is available at the complex site for both spectators and teams. Please follow directional signs to appropriate parking areas. Spectator parking is in the Canyons parking lot. Bus/Team Parking will be on 2100 West. *Please follow directional signs to designated parking areas*. All parking is free of charge. *See Site Map for additional information*.

Restrooms

Restroom facilities will be available and are located in the center of the complex adjacent to the concession stand.

General Information

Credentials

Teams and Delegations: Credentials passes are mandatory for entrance into the complex. Please make sure that all of your players and staff are carrying their credentials passes at all times. Credentials are only for rostered players, coaching staff and official college staff. **Spectators will not be issued credentials passes.**

Coach's packets, including team credentials passes, will be delivered to each team's assigned hotel prior to their arrival

Media: A media credentials pass will be required for entry into the Canyons, upon receipt of a Media Accreditation Request. *See Media Section for more information*. Media members who are not employees of the college, can pick up their passes at the Will-Call Booth at the Spectator Entrance to the Canyons. Team Sports Information Directors will have their media credentials given to the Head Coach as part of team packet.

Recruiters: A recruiter credentials pass will be required for entry into the Canyons, upon receipt of a Recruiter Accreditation Request. *See Recruiter Section for more information.*

Approved media/recruiter credentials passes can be picked up at the Will-Call Booth at the Spectator Entrance to the Canyons.

First Aid

First aid will be available at the park for all participants and spectators. *Please refer to Facility Site Plan for First Aid Station Location*.

Concessions

A full service concession stand is available with a wide variety of foods and drinks.

Teams may have specific food needs related to medical conditions and given the nature of tournaments; teams may bring beverages and food with them, through the team gate.

Spectator's personal coolers are prohibited inside the complex. Please inform parents, friends and fans of the rules related to coolers. Teams may bring a cooler. We will have water and bags of ice in each dugout. We will also bring around a basket of fruit before every game for the teams.

Hospitality

Hospitality will be provided for coaches, college administration, umpires and NJCAA delegates throughout the tournament. Media and Recruiters hospitality passes are available for pre-purchase for \$49, which includes unlimited access to the hospitality suite all four days of the tournament. The deadline for purchasing the pass is May 20, 2019.

Medical Facilities

Athletic Training

There will be a certified Athletic Trainer from the local Sports Medicine team at Dixie Regional Medical Center on site to assist with your athletes' health care needs. It will be held in the crows nest on the side closest to fields #3 right next to the stairs. If you are a certified athletic trainer traveling with your team, you are welcome to use the space. Please make sure your information is on the form submitted for your team so that the athletic trainer pass will be given for the tournament. Unless otherwise requested, only one athletic trainer pass per school will be given.

Directions to Medical Facility: From the complex, head east on Snow Canyon Parkway, turn right on Bluff Street and drive 2.8 miles to 700 South. Turn left on 700 South and drive 1.6 miles to River Road, turn left and drive 0.3 miles to the hospital on your right.

Official Ball

The official tournament ball will be provided by Dudley.

On-Field Photography

Spectators will not be permitted on game fields at any time. Only those with approved Media Credentials passes will be granted access to game fields.

Playing Diamond

The diamonds are dirt infield mix with grass outfields. The home run fence distances are 220 in center and 195 down the lines. The outfield fence height is 6 feet.

Pre-Tournament Skills Clinic

A highlight of the 2019 NJCAA Division I Softball National Championship Tournament is our Pre-Tournament Skills Clinic on Monday, May 20th from 5:00 PM – 6:30 PM at the Canyon's Complex. Local youth softball players will have the opportunity to further develop their playing skills through interaction with National Championship Tournament players. Each tournament team will be required to provide 4 players who will serve as clinicians. A special feature of the clinic will be our special guest clinician Leah Amico.

Rain Out / Game Delay

When a game is underway, and it starts to rain/snow, only the umpire can suspend the game. Suspended games will be continued from the point that play was suspended. The official scorebook will have the point of suspension, outs, etc. recorded.

The official NJCAA Rules will be followed regarding weather conditions and suspended play. *In the event of unavoidable delays due to either weather or unforeseen causes, the Tournament Director and NJCAA Representative reserve the right to re-schedule game times or make other arrangements as necessary as long as there is no extension to the length of the tournament dates.* NJCAA Rule Reference: Page 195, Rule 15.10 and Page 204 Appendix G.

Rain Out Game Delay Tickets

In the event of a rain delay or game suspension due to weather, or any other reason, anyone with a valid wristband, will be admitted to the rescheduled game. Tournament wristbands cannot be exchanged or refunded for any dollar value.

Tournament Program

The Official *Full Color* Souvenir Tournament Program, including team photos and tournament game schedule, will be available for purchase on site at a cost of \$12.00.

Team Tournament Uniforms

For the National Tournament, it is the responsibility of the visiting team to ensure its jersey is of a contrasting color to that selected by the home team. Furthermore, if the uniforms don't contrast enough, the visiting team has to change their jerseys.

Dress Decorum

At the national tournament venue, anyone on the playing field, in the dugout or warm up area must comply with the dress decorum policy:

- **A**. Player's attire as addressed in the NJCAA Softball Rulebook.
- **B**. Coaches (including those in the dugout) must wear official institutional matching apparel (color and logo) to include matching polo or crew necked shirts (no tshirts), shorts and/or slacks (no denim/jeans), and shoes and socks (no sandals, flip-flops). Head gear must be worn in an appropriate manner.
- C. All other team personnel (including trainers, SID's, etc.) must wear appropriate institutional polo or crew necked shirts (no t-shirts), shorts and/or slacks (no denim/jeans), shoes and socks (no sandals, flip-flops). Head gear must be worn in an appropriate manner.
- **D**. Participating team members and college personnel returning to the tournament venue as spectators shall be appropriately attired.
- **E**. Banquet attire, unless otherwise designated by the Tournament Host, will be casual business attire (t-shirts, denim pants, hats, shorts, sandals, flip-flops will not be permitted).
- **F**. Violators of dress decorum will be asked by either the Tournament Director or the NJCAA Representative to change dress to comply with the stated dress decorum. If they don't comply, the incident will be referred to the Standards & Ethics Committee for possible sanctions.

Showers

There are **no shower facilities available** on site. Each team is responsible for making any necessary arrangements with their hotels.



From:

Best Western Abbey Inn: Take Bluff Street north to Snow Canyon Parkway, turn left and follow, turning left at 2000N and follow directional signs.

Clarion Suites: Go north on Main St., turn left on St. George Blvd. until it dead ends in to Bluff St. Turn right until you see the Snow Canyon turnoff on the LEFT. Turn left and continue to 2000 N. where you will turn left and follow the directional signs.

Desert Garden Inn: Go west on Hilton Dr. and turn right at the first intersection onto S Black Ridge Dr. Keep left to stay on Bluff St. Continue on Bluff St. until you see the exit for Snow Canyon Pkwy. Turn left onto Snow Canyon Pkwy. and continue to 2000 N. where you will turn left and follow directional signs.

NJCAA Radio and TV Policy

"All radio and broadcasts rights for the championship are held by the NJCAA. NJCAA TV will video broadcast games 27-31. Radio and video broadcasts of games prior to Game 27 are permitted but must be coordinated through the Tournament Director. No video broadcasts of games 27-31 will be permitted other than NJCAA TV. Accreditation

A media credentials pass will be required for entry into the Canyons. Field Facilities

- 1 First Round Format will be as follows:
 - a. Competitors will be split into Group A and Group B. Group A will compete on Field 5 and Group B will compete on Field 4. The competitors will be randomly pre-drawn to determine which Group.
 - b. For the First Round, each competitor will get two live practice swings and then 10 official swings.
 - i. The screen can be moved by the pitcher as long as it stays within the foul lines.
 - ii. Pitches that are not swung at will not count toward the total.*
 - iii. The number of home runs after 10 official swings will be noted.
 - iv. The top two finishers from each group will advance to the final round on field 4.
 - v. If any ties exist for the top two spots, the following tiebreaker will be used:
 - 1. Each competitor that is tied will get 5 swings (no practice). The competitor with the most home runs after their swings will get the spot in the final. If competitors are still tied, each competitor will have a sudden-death "swing off" where they will get 1 swing each. (Ex: Player 1 and 2 are still tied Player 1 hits a homerun on her swing. If Player 2 hits a homerun on her swing, it continues. If Player 2 doesn't hit a homerun, Player 1 advances to the final)
- 2. Final Round Format will be as follows:
 - a. Final Round will be held on Field 4.
 - b. Each competitor will get 1 practice swing and 5 official swings.*
 - c. The top finisher will be the Home Run Derby Champion.
 - i. If a tie exists for first place, all tied competitors will have a sudden-death "swing off" as outlined above to determine the champion.

^{*}Total of 24 balls will be allowed for each round.



ARTICLE XX

CODE OF CONDUCT FOR ALL NATIONAL EVENTS, CONTESTS AND TOURNAMENTS

SPONSORED BY THE NATIONAL JUNIOR COLLEGE ATHLETIC ASSOCIATION

This code of conduct applies to all region, district and national events, contests and tournaments sponsored by the National Junior College Athletic Association. Violations of the code of conduct occurring during the regularly scheduled season events shall be referred to the respective conference or region Standards and Ethics Committee. The jurisdiction of the NJCAA Code of Conduct ends when colleges competing in such tournaments arrive back on their respective campuses.

Code of Conduct

- A. Participants shall recognize the responsibility for proper conduct at any national tournament, event or contest sponsored by the NJCAA or its member colleges.
- B. Coaches shall recognize and assume responsibility for the actions of themselves and the team members. Each coach who has participants competing in the event shall be responsible for informing each participant about the Code of Conduct.

Behavior

Coaches, players and institutional personnel must remember that they are representatives of an institution of higher learning, its faculty, administration and student body. As such, they are expected to conduct themselves in a manner which would reflect credit on their team, institution, region and the NJCAA. Student-athletes, coaches and institutional personnel who are participating in NJCAA events are subject to all NJCAA rules, regulations and penalties as stated in the NJCAA Handbook as well as local, state and federal laws.

Inappropriate and unacceptable behavior by coaches, players or institutional personnel will not be tolerated before, during, or after contests; at the hotel or in public while representing their college. This Code of Conduct does not replace Article XVIII of the NJCAA Handbook. Unacceptable forms of behavior include, but are not limited to:

- 1. Fighting
- 2. Taunting
- 3. Inappropriate celebration
- 4. Disrespectful attitude toward opponents, officials, tournament administrators
- 5. Use of profane and vulgar language
- 6. Use of tobacco, drugs and/or alcohol
- 7. Disrespectful attitude toward host hotel personnel
- 8. Unlawful activities

Derogatory Comments

Coaches, athletes or institutional personnel shall not make derogatory public comments regarding administration of a tournament or officiating of contests during post game interviews or at other times; to print or broadcast media, in news releases or institutionally produced news releases or under any conditions when their comments may become public. The head coach shall be fully responsible for assuring that no public comments are made by the coaching staff, student-athletes or institutional personnel about officiating, fighting or other incidents which occur during contests.

A coach shall not address or permit anyone in the team area to address uncomplimentary remarks to any game official during the progress of a contest or engage in conduct which might incite student-athletes or spectators against officials.

Reporting

Violations of the Code of Conduct may be reported to the Executive Director of the NJCAA or his/her designee. Procedures and Penalties

Immediate Action

Where immediate action is needed to alleviate or control a situation, the Executive Director or his/her designee shall have the authority to act at his/her sole discretion. Examples of events which would require immediate action include, but are not limited to, the following:

- · Allegation of serious misconduct requiring immediate suspension of institutional personnel or student-athletes from competition.
- Instances where the Executive Director or his/her designee deems it necessary to protect the equity and integrity of

the competition.

- · Protection of the event's officiating program, particularly in an instance where public comments by an institutional representative may affect competition.
- Any instance or circumstance which might affect the safety of officials, participants or spectators attending the event.

Penalties-Immediate Action

The Executive Director or his/her designee may issue any penalty that he/she believes appropriate to any student-athlete or institutional personnel who has violated the regulations pertaining to conduct when the Executive Director or his/her designee concludes that immediate action is required. The actions of the Executive Director or his/her designee shall be final and binding but shall be reported to the Standards and Ethics Committee within one (1) week.

Timely Action

In cases where immediate action is not required but where sanctions are warranted, the Executive Director or his/her designee may issue the following penalties:

Reprimand: The NJCAA Executive Director or NJCAA Standards and Ethics Committee may issue a letter of reprimand to the coach, player or institutional personnel who violates the regulations pertaining to conduct. Copies of the letter of reprimand will be sent to the Director of Athletics and the President of the institution.

Probation, suspension and other penalties: If the misconduct is serious enough, the Executive Director or his/her designee may issue other penalties which may include, but are not limited to, probation, suspension or disqualification of the coach, player or institutional personnel from participating in one or more contests.

NJCAA Sportsmanship Public Announcement

This announcement should be used at all NJCAA National Tournaments before each session, each day of the tournament.
